# Structure for Implementation – Functions and Responsibilities

## PEGUIS MEMBERS

#### **Chief and Council**

#### Land Selection Advisory Committee

#### 7 Committee members

- 5 Peguis members appointed from on and off reserve
- · 2 appointed by Chief & Council
- · Define land selection and purchase plan
- Recommend Crown land selections to Council

#### **Land Purchase Committee**

#### 3 Committee members

- · 1 Councillor, Claims Portfolio
- 1 Implementation Manager
- · Staff Legal Advisor
- · Review recommended land purchases
- Recommend Council Resolutions requesting Reserve creation
- Monitor implementation of TLE settlement
- Report on progress to Council and members
- Designated representative sits on Peguis Implementation Committee

#### DECISION MAKING

- Monitor and approve implementation budget
- Approve identified land selections and purchases
- Approve Community Purposes funding amounts between \$50,000 and \$150,000

#### IMPLEMENTATION MANAGEMENT

- · 1 Implementation Manager
- · 1 Assistant
- · Identify suitable private and Crown land
- · Confirm selections of identified land
- Negotiate and recommend purchase of private land
- Prepare and submit proposals for additions to reserves
- Monitor and report to Council and members on selections, purchases, and reserve creation

## **Peguis First Nation Trust**

(Two Trustee Functions)

#### FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

#### 7 F.M. trustees

- 5 Peguis members elected from on and off reserve
- 2 (accountant, lawyer or corporate trustee) appointed by Chief & Council
- · chairperson selected by the trustees
- · Determine investment philosophy
- · Hire an investment manager
- · Make investment decisions
- · Dispense funding for land purchases and implementation
- · Dispense approved Community Purposes funding
- · Prepare regular oral and written reports
- · Provide annual audit to the membership

#### COMMUNITY PURPOSES FUNDING

#### 5 C. P. trustees

- · 5 Peguis members elected from on and off reserve
- · chairperson selected by the trustees
- Define Community Purposes projects for use of federal payment only (\$5,000,000)
- · Determine funding criteria
- Approve Community Purposes funding up to \$50,000
- Recommend Community Purposes funding amounts between \$50,000 and \$150,000 to Chief and Council for approval
- Recommend Community Purposes funding amounts over \$150,000 to the membership for approval
- · Prepare regular oral and written reports
