An Interview with Freda Bear

The Peguis First Nation flag has a long history, an interesting meaning and has managed to make its way around the world. It was created by one of our very own Elders and she made it for the people of Peguis.

In 1983, a young Freda Bear working as a Accounting Assistant in Peguis Finance was unhappy with the band letterhead. To Freda, the letterhead did not look good and the band office would often receive phone calls from people thinking we were a musical band.

Freda asked Peguis Chief and Council if she could attempt to create a better letterhead for Peguis. A letterhead that reflected Peguis and its people. Leadership at this time were, Chief Louis J. Stevenson, Councillor Albert Thompson, Councillor Edith Bear, Councillor Carl Bird and Councillor Colin Williams.

While Freda was working on the new

design, she recalled the attending band meetings and what the elders would say. They would speak about treaties and how the next generation needed to remember our traditions and way of life.

Freda used some markers and began designing. On one design, she drew a yellow line, a green line, then a blue line on top of each other. Yellow representing the sun shining, green representing the grass growing and blue representing the water flowing. It was still not complete to Freda. She added a red circle to the middle, to represent our people and the circle of life.

Freda presented the design to Chief and Council and suggested it be made into a flag because we are a nation. Leadership at the time, approved the flag design and later presented Freda with the first ever Peguis First Nation flag as a gift. Freda remembers her biggest supporters of the flag were her family, Chief Louis J. Stevenson, Councillor Carl Bird.

The original flag gifted to Freda Bear was hung in the St.Mathews Church until in 2018, when the church was broken into and the flag was stolen. This flag is an important artifact in our community's history.

If anyone has, or has seen, this flag (which has "Freda Bear" and "1st Peguis Flag" written on it) is asked to return it anonymously to the band office. There will be no questions asked.

Travelled Around the World

The Peguis flag has made its way to places around the world, it's been on TV numerous times and has been placed onto items such as sweaters, hats, pens, jerseys, cups and much more.

On one occassion, several Peguis flags were taken to England where Freda attended school. In the photo with the Late Reverend Canon Barry Bear, several flags were gifted to Freda's colleagues. After the photo was taken, her colleagues returned to their home countries of England, Indonesia, Angola (Africa), Brazil and India with their Peguis flags.

Peguis flags are permanently displayed at locations such as: Lower Fort Garry National Historic Site, Assiniboia Downs (Winnipeg), Old Stone Church (Selkirk), 1075 Portage Ave (Winnipeg),

Future plans include placing a permanent Peguis flag at the former Kapyong Barracks site.

WINTERIZE Your Home Checklist

It's that time of year again, it's time to get your home ready for winter.

Here are a few things you can do to prevent winter damage and keep your home warm and comfortable all season long. Before the cold weather starts, tackle this winter checklist:

Turn off exterior faucets
If you have a sump pump diverter, switch from field to tank
Seal gaps and use window and door weather stripping
Mark driveways for snow graders
Plastic wrap windows
If you own a generator, check oil and have extra gas available
Check extension cords to make sure they work
Make sure you have enough medical supplies and prescriptions
For septic tanks, hay bales can be placed above to prevent freezing
Have a home emergency kit ready (Candles, snacks, first aid kit, blanket, water, flashlight, batteries, radio)
Keep wireless devices charged prior to storms

Clifton attended Peguis Central School and graduated in 2009. He identified the need in the community for pick-ups and deliveries on a variety of items. Clifton turned that need into a business.

N.C. Transportation is a pick-up/ delivery service for businesses and private residents in Peguis First Nation and surrounding areas. Started in 2021, Clifton has been servicing Peguis and surrounding communities. Customers are located throughout the Interlake and pickups include a variety of items. The business name, N.C. Transportation, was created by Clifton and stands for his daughter's name Nova Campbell.

Most of the pick-ups are located in Winnipeg and Selkirk areas, however N.C. Transportation does make stops wherever needed.

using N.C. By Transportation, customers that live on reserve can save the tax's on items. Delivery dates are Tuesdays and Thursdays. Pick up fee depend on parcel size. Type of pick-ups include:

COVID-19 ISOLATION GUIDELINES

As of August 23, 2022



COVID-19 VACCINE

- * Peguis Health Centre Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm. Walk-ins welcome. COVID Vaccine Booster doses available. Call ahead to confirm vaccines available. Vaccines are ordered every 4 weeks.
- * COVID Vaccines available for those 6 months to elderly.
- * Tuesday and Thursdays are reserved for Infant and School vaccines. If a nurse is available on Tuesday or Thursday, you may call ahead to request for a COVID Vaccine.
- * Booster doses recommended for 12 years and over to reduce the severity of COVID.

COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

* If you are having cold symptoms-sniffles, sore throat, achy body, cough, nasal stuffiness, nose is dripping, fever or headache then do a COVID home test. If you feel that you are having a difficult time to breathe or short of breath than you can call the ambulance (204) 645-2000 or make your way to the hospital. Please call ahead to the hospital (204) 372-8444 so they are expecting you.

HOME TEST KITS

- * Available from Peguis Health Monday to Friday 9:00 am 5:00 pm.
- * Please keep kits available for your use should you need them after hours or on weekends. Health does not deliver COVID Test kits after hours or on weekends.
- * Health has 3 different types of home test kits, and each has their own directions to perform the test correctly. Make sure and follow directions as listed.
- * If your Home Test is +COVID call Peguis Command Centre (204) 645-2869 or (204) 645-4738 provide them with your name, call back number and a nurse will get back to you.
- * Please inform your employer/supervisor of your results.
- * Grocery Stores in Winnipeg, Fisher Branch and Arborg have FREE COVID test kits.

COVID-19+ ISOLATION

- * COVID + must isolate until they are symptom free for 24 hours and a negative home test to make sure you are no longer contagious before resuming normal activities.
- * People who test +COVID and no symptoms are advised to isolate for 5 days and if any symptoms develop to isolate until they are 24 hours symptom free.

CONTACTS OF A COVID-19+ PERSON

- * Regardless of vaccination status do not need to isolate but:
- * They must self-monitor for symptoms for 14 days and if they develop any cold or COVID symptoms they must do a home test. If you have symptoms and your home test is negative for 3 days in a row, then you are declared negative COVID.
- * If the home test is even a faint pink line means +COVID.

ALTERNATE ISOLATION ACCOMMODATIONS (AIA)

- * If you test +COVID and there are more than and few people in home and you would like to isolate away from your household-Health can arrange alternate isolation in WPG.
- * Health recommends isolating away if you have a large family as COVID maybe passed onto the others in the home. This just reduces the risk of illness for anyone else in the home.
- * This is arranged daily 9:00 am 3:00 pm.


